However, plants will be allocated in the order in which members' order forms are received, on the basis of one plant per variety per membership. After this allocation, any surplus will be divided amongst multiple orders.

Substitutions: You may list acceptable substitutions for specific plants by writing 'Sub' with the numbered plant. Please note that the mark-up on these plants is minimal; For this reason we are not able to provide a warranty.

**Plants are to be paid for when they are picked up. Payment by cheque or interac-e transfer is preferred, but cash will of course be accepted. Do not send payment with your order form. Plants will not be shipped. If you are unable to pick up your plants on this day, please arrange to have someone pick them up for you with payment.*

We have an exciting and extensive selection being offered this year including many Rhododendrons and companion plants. Members have an opportunity to gain access to a number of choice, rare and unusual plants, most of which are not commercially or readily available. There's a limited quantity for many of the plants offered. We recommend ordering early! Thank you for being patient. A notification will go out asking for volunteers to help with this sale.

LEPIDOTE RHODODENDRONS (RhodoLand Nursery)

1. ***R. 'Angel Powder'*** – (*carolinianum* 'Epoch' x white *mucronulatum*). One of Delp's best hybrids. Large trusses of wavy-edged, dainty white flowers very subtly flushed pink in mid-spring. Upright-growing, dense habit to 5'(1.5m) high. Sensational, vigorous & floriferous. Hardy to at least -15F(-26C). Zone 5a. (**4 gal. – \$40.00**)
2. ***R. augustinii 'Hobbie'*** – A Dietrich Hobbie hybrid. In mid-spring flowers range from white to deep violet blue, usually with a yellow-green or brownish blotch on upper lobes, about 4-5 cm across, 2-6 flowers per cluster. Colour on the same plant may vary slightly from year to year. Leaves are oblong-lanceolate 4-10 cm long, 1.3-2.5 cm wide, tapering to a fine point, dark green above, underside densely scaly (feels fuzzy), especially the mid-rib, petiole pubescent. Habit is compact, upright, can become narrow and tall. Try this in your coastal garden! Height: 6 ft (1.8 m). Zone 6a, -5F(-20C). (**2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available**)
3. ***R. 'Biskra'*** – (*cinnabarinum Roylei Group* x *ambiguum*). A de Rothschild hybrid. Unusual orange flower colour bearing clusters of large, hanging and waxy, vermilion bells in late spring. Elliptical, leathery dark-green leaves. A sturdy upright, somewhat vase-shaped habit and easily grown in light shade. This is an original de Rothschild hybrid that, due to the *ambiguum* in its parentage, is considered one of the hardiest of the *cinnabarinum* hybrids and is relatively resistant to powdery mildew. Grows 6-8' (1.8-2.4m) high x 4-5' (1.2-1.5m) wide. Zone 6b; possibly colder, -5F(-20C). (**3 gal. – \$40.00; only a few available**)

4. **R. 'Bubblegum'** – (Tetraploid 'Weston's Aglo') A tetraploid introduction by Brigg's Nursery of R. 'Weston's Aglo' with larger flowers and foliage. Flowers are pink with a reddish blotch in early spring. 'PJM'-like dark green foliage turns burgundy in fall. Grows to 3'(.9m) high and wide in 10 years. Zone 6; probably colder, -5F (-20C). (2 gal. – \$35.00)
5. **R. carolinianum** – (pastel pink; from seed) Shell pink trumpet-shaped flowers with pink throats at the ends of the branches in mid-spring. It has dark green foliage with brown undersides. The glossy narrow leaves remain dark green throughout the winter. Open multi-stemmed, with an upright spreading habit of growth. Plant in bright shade-dappled sunlight. Height: 6'. Spread: 6', Zone 5a, -15F (-26.1C). (1 gal. – \$30.00)
6. **R. carolinianum (Barbara Hall's best)** – (R. minus Carolinianum Group) Propagations of an excellent specimen of this tough species from the garden of Kathy Hall. Its pale pink flowers are born in perfect rounded trusses on a dense plant. Dark green elliptic foliage to 3" long. Dense rounded habit to 6'(1.8m) high and wide. Requires excellent drainage and preferably on the dry side in summer once established. Will tolerate part shade but habit and bud set will be better in full sun. Should be in every garden. Zone 5a, -15F (-26.1C). (1 gal. – \$30.00)
7. **R. 'Faisa'** - A Delp hybrid. In mid-spring, reddish-purple trusses of 6 open to a blend of light purple and moderate purplish pink flowers 5 cm across. A dense, compact, upright form with bronze foliage. Reaches 1m high and wide in 10 years. Zone 4b, -20F (-29°C). (2 gal. – \$35.00)
8. **R. 'Jackie's Blue'** - A Jack Looye (Rhodoland Nursery) hybrid. A large-flowering pale purple-blue tetraploid *carolinianum*. Upright habit. Zone 6, -5F (-20C); possibly colder. (2 gal. – \$35.00)
9. **R. 'Landmark'** – A Weston hybrid. Similar to PJM but with large rounded trusses of vibrant dark pink flowers opening from red buds. Appears almost red from a distance. Bronze winter foliage with good leaf retention. Habit similar to PJM but slightly more compact. Grows 6-8' (1.8-2.4m) high x 4-5' (1.2-1.5m) wide. Zone 4b, -20F(-29C). (2 gal. – \$35.00)
10. **R. (maximum x aureum) F2** – Lavender pink flowers. A small, tightly compact plant, extremely bushy and grows to under .5m in 20 years. (2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)
11. **R. mucronulatum 'Cornell Pink'** - A beautiful selection of this deciduous species with large bright rose-pink flowers in profusion. Blooms very early in spring before the leaves emerge. Ethereal in the fog! Golden yellow fall colour. Upright willowy habit to 9' (2.7m) high. Requires excellent drainage. Zone 5. (2 gal. – \$35.00)
12. **R. 'Olga Mezitt'** - (*minus* var *minus* Compact Form x *dauricum* hybrid) A Weston hybrid. Masses of ball-shaped trusses of clear pink flowers that do not fade in early to mid-spring. Dark green foliage turns bronze-copper in the fall. Dense, mounded, upright habit. Height: 4'. Spread: 3' in 10 years. Zone 4a, -25°F(-32°C). (2 gal. – \$35.00)
13. **R. oreotrephes** – Flowers are funnel shaped to funnel campanulate, lavender-pink, sometimes spotted in early to mid-spring. Leaves are oblong or obovate to orbicular, up to 3½" long, often bluish. Upright, compact habit. Height: 5' in 10 years. Zone 6b, 0°F (-18°C). (2 gal. – \$35.00)
14. **R. 'Penheale Blue'** – (*concinnum* Pseudoyanthinum Group X *russatum*). Stunning bright violet-blue flowers, flushed red, that appear in profusion covering the entire plant in mid-spring. The smaller, roundish

foliage is dark-green in summer turning an attractive dark-bronze in winter. An upright, bushy habit. A rare plant for the collector! Height: 4'. Spread: 4'. Zone 6a, -5F (-21C). **(1 gal. – \$30.00; only a few available)**

15. **R. 'Purple Gem'** – Masses of purple-violet flowers in early to mid-spring. The new growth is a bright blue green and the foliage turns bronze in winter. Small growth habit. Excellent in a rock garden or small garden. Height: 2'. Spread: 3'. Zone 4a, -25F (-31.7C). **(2 gal. – \$35.00)**
16. **R. 'Senegal'** – Covered in beautiful soft-pink flowers. Very limited information could be found. Briefly mentioned in JARS journal. A rare plant for the collector! **(2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)**

ELEPIDOTE RHODODENDRONS (RhodoLand Nursery)

17. **R. 'Anna H. Hall'** - (*catawbiense* var *album* x *degronianum* ssp *yakushmanum* 'Koichiro Wada') A Leach hybrid. Trusses of 14-15 open to campanulate flowers (5 cm) across are white faintly flushed with light pink, in mid-spring. Leaves are 19 cm long, dark green with faint brown indumentum. Dense, compact growth habit. Very heat and sun tolerant once established. Height: 3' in 10 years. Zone 4a, -25F (-32C). **(1 gal. – \$30.00)**
18. **R. 'Bellefontaine'** - (*fortune* x *smirnowii*) A fine Kentville selection by Don Craig, a sister to Evangeline. Big trusses of lovely rose-pink flowers up to 3.5 inches across and borne above the leaves in early spring; pleasantly scented. Long dark green leaves. Open-type growth habit to form a large plant more than 8' high. Zone 5. **(2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)**
19. **R. *brachycarpum*** - The flowers are white to pale rose with yellowish-brownish green spots in the throat. The foliage is incredibly handsome oblong with rounded bases. Dwarf, mounding habit, withstands wind and dry mineral soil better than most *Rhododendrons*. Height: 4'. Spread: 4'. Zone 5b-6a, -10F (-23C) or even colder. **(2 gal. – \$35.00)**
20. **R. *brachycarpum* var. *roseum*** – Incredibly nice clean foliage. Slow growing, compact, mounding habit. Fine form! Perfect for the small garden. Zone 5a, -20F (-29C). **(1 gal. – \$30.00; only a few available)**
21. **R. 'Brown Eyes'** - (*fortunei* ssp *fortunei* x unknown) A Boseley/Dexter hybrid. Large ball-shaped trusses of large clear pink flowers with a golden-brown flare (hence 'brown eyes'). Dark green foliage. A well-branched habit. Height and spread: 6' in 10 years. Zone 5a, -29°C (-20F). **(2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)**
22. **R. 'Calsap'** - ('Catalgl'a' x 'Sappho') Lavender buds open into large conical trusses of snowy white flowers with a large dramatic burgundy blotch. Dense emerald green foliage. Vigorous, broad upright habit to 5'(1.5m) high in 10 years. Zone 5. An ARHS "Top Ten" elepidote and a real showstopper. A must have! **(3 gal. – \$40.00)**
23. **R. 'Capistrano'** - (Hindustan x {[*catawbiense*, white x (*fortunei* ssp. *discolor* x Fabia Group)] x (Russell Harmon x Goldsworth Orange)} x Golden Gala). A complex Leach hybrid reported to be his best yellow. Clear, pale yellow flowers with frilly edges are borne in mid to late-spring. Excellent dark green foliage. A compact well-branched plant. To 5'(1.5m) high and wide. Zone 6, -15F (-26C). **(2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)**
24. **R. 'Charles Loomis'** – (English Roseum x *hyperythrum*). A Thornton hybrid. Rounded trusses open to

blush pink and quickly fade to white in early to mid-spring. The foliage is narrow and recurved, retaining its leaves for 3 to 4 years. Buds heavily. Round plant habit. Height: 6'. Zone 5b, -15F (26.1C) . A tough plant with nice traits! **(2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)**

25. **R. 'County of York' (or, 'Catalode')** – (Catawbiense Album x Loderi King George). A Gable hybrid. In mid-spring large dome-shaped trusses of 13 open to broadly funnel-shaped flowers, 4" across, white with olive-green blotch in the throat. Leaves are elliptic, convex, up to 10" long, glossy, dark green. A vigorous, open growth habit. Prefers light shade. Height: 6'. Zone 5b, -15F (26.1C). **(2 gal. – \$35.00; only one available)**
26. **R. 'Crete'** – (*smirnowii* x *degronianum ssp.yakushmanum*). A Leach hybrid. Buds are purplish-pink, as are the flowers before they eventually age to white. Mid-spring bloom is followed by silvery new growth. Leaves have a heavy tan indumentum and are held for 4 years. The plant has a low, mounding habit and is broader than tall. An excellent year round foliage plant! Height: 4' in 10 years. Zone 5. **(2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)**
27. **R. 'Dark Lord'** – A sibling to the dark purple *R. 'Tapestry'*. Selected at Weston Nursery. In mid-spring neat plump trusses open to dramatic merlot-red, ruffled blooms with prominent white anthers. Dark green leaves. Thrives in partial shade with a fast growth rate. Height: 5-8'. Spread: 5-8'. Zone 5a, -20F (-29C). Possibly colder. **(2 gal. – \$35.00)**.
28. **R. 'English Roseum'** – Profuse, large, dome-shaped clusters of 8 to 10, trumpet-shaped, lilac rose flowers with delicate orange freckles in late spring to early summer. Large green narrow leaves with a compact upright habit. A reliable 'iron-clad'. Tolerates shade well. Height: 6'. Zone 4b, -25F (-31.7C). **(1 gal. – \$30.00)**
29. **R. 'Francesca'** - ('Britannia' x 'Dexter #202') Tough, red and big! Large deep-red flowers from very large trusses in late-spring. Very vigorous with an upright-open habit suited to the rear of a planting. Definitely not for the small garden or foundation planting. Grows to 10'(3.0m) or more high. Best in light shade as flowers may scorch in the afternoon sun. Zone 6. **(3 gal. – \$40.00; only a few available)**
30. **R. 'Fred Peste'** – [(*degronianum ssp yakushmanum* x Corona) x *haematodes*]. A Peste hybrid. In mid-spring, flat trusses of 14 flowers open to widely funnel-campanulate, 3" across, cardinal red, darker in the throat with deep red spots. Leaves are narrowly elliptic, convex, leathery, about 3½" long; dark olive green with heavy orange-yellow indumentum; recurved edges. Upright, stiff-branched habit. Appreciates filtered to full sun. Height 3'. Spread 3'. Listed as Zone: 7, 0°F (-18°C). **(2 gal. – \$35.00)**
31. **R. 'Goldkrone'** – [(*wardii var. wardii* x 'Alice Street') x 'Hachmann's Marina']. Trusses of luminous light golden-yellow flowers, delicately freckled with reddish brown on their upper lobes in late-spring to early-summer. Handsome foliage of ovate, slightly curled, dark green leaves. Never fails to provide a splendid display! Height: 5'. Spread: 5'. Zone 6a, -5F (-21C). **(1 gal. – \$30.00; only a few available)**
32. **R. 'Goldprinz'** – A *yakushmanum* hybrid with coppery-bronze buds. In late-spring to early-summer the trusses open reddish orange, then change to an intense yellow with a wine-red throat and red spots in the upper petal. The foliage is dark-green, shiny and broadly elliptic. A compact growing habit. The flowers cover the plant fully, and last longer than most rhododendrons and getting the reputation as one of the very best yellow flowering rhododendrons. Climates with severe winters should provide some protection. Height: 3'. Spread: 3'. Zone 6a, -5F (-21C) possibly colder. **(2 gal. – \$35.00)**

33. **R. 'Goldstrike'** – (*oreotrephes* x 'Royal Flush'). In mid-spring small fleshy trusses open to tubular flowers that are aureole yellow with buttercup-yellow in the upper petal lobes. Glossy dark-green foliage. Stiff, upright habit. An outstanding, unusual plant for the collector! Height: 4'. Spread: 4'. Zone 6b, -0F (-18C) possibly colder. (2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)
34. **R. 'Golden Gate'** – (*dichroanthum* ssp. *scyphocalyx* x unknown). In mid to late-spring open trusses display small, bell shaped flowers of reddish-pink with orange-rose edge and a pale orange throat. Leaves are deep green and glossy; retained for three years. A nice compact, mounding habit. This plant is unique and should be sheltered from strong winds. Height: 4'. Spread: 4'. Zone 6b, -0F (-18C) possibly colder. (2 gal. – \$35.00)
35. **R. 'Harold Amateis'** – (*maximum* x *strigillosum*). An Amateis hybrid. A superb cardinal-red with a dark maroon throat and darker spots. This hybrid closely resembles *R. strigillosum* with trusses of 20 flowers in mid to late-spring. Long, narrow, medium green leaves. Height: 5'(1.5m) in 10 years. Broader than tall. Bud hardy to Zone 5b, -10F (-23C) possibly colder. One of the very best shades of red in a hardy hybrid; Superb! (1 gal. – \$30.00; only a few available)
36. **R. 'Holden'** – Hybridised by Shammarello. Rose-red blooms in mid-spring. Foliage is glossy dark-green. A compact habit. Height: 4'. Spread: 5'. Zone 5b, -15F (-26C). (2 gal. – \$35.00)
37. **R. 'Holden's Splendor'** – As observed, flowers are pink with blotch. Not on the market, therefore, no information is available. (2 gal. – \$35.00)
38. **R. Holden's # 93-24A** – Not on the market, therefore, information not available. (2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)
39. **R. Holden's 05-114#27** – Not on the market, therefore, information not available. (2 gal. – \$35.00)
40. **R. Holden's 88-32 #96-1** – Not on the market, therefore, information not available. (2 gal. – \$35.00)
41. **R. 'Janet Blair'** – A Dexter hybrid. Large, fragrant pale pink flowers with ruffled edges and a large gold-green flare. Dark glossy green foliage. Vigorous with a rounded, dense, well-branched habit. Height 6'. Spread: 8'. Zone 5b, -15F (-26C). An ARHS proven performer and awarded ARS Plant of The Year in 2012. (2 gal. – \$35.00)
42. **R. 'Lavender Princess'** – [possibly *R. fortunei* x *R. catawbiense*]. A Dexter hybrid. Lightly scented flowers are lavender mauve with pink and lilac blush in mid-spring. Glossy green narrow leaves. A compact habit. Height: 4'. Spread: 4'. Zone 4b, -20F (-29C). (1 gal. – \$30.00).
43. **R. 'Lem's Monarch'** – (Anna x Marinus Koster). Smashing! In late spring-early summer, giant dome-shaped pink trusses of 16 open to white flowers, with wavy soft-pink edges, two narrow rays of red spots in the upper lobe. Large, olive green leaves are attached with red petioles. Moderately dense, fast growing habit. Height: 8'. Spread: 8' in 10 years. Give it space to grow. Will be a specimen in time. Zone 6a, -5F (-21C). (2 gal. – \$35.00; only one available)
44. **R. 'Marie Fortie'** – [unknown parentage]. Hybridised pre 1925 by B. Fortie in Ghent, Belgium. Trusses of large, rich pink, funnel-shaped flowers with blotches of dark purple in the throat are borne in late-spring to early-summer. Elliptic, leathery, glossy, dark green leaves. Upright to spreading growth habit. Height: 5'. Spread: 6'. Zone 5b, -15F (-26C). (2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)

45. **R. *maximum*** – This rose-red flowering form flowers in late spring. The foliage tends to be significantly large, 9 inches long (23 cm), flat, and dark green, often retaining a thin indumentum under the leaves. New foliage can be quite attractive. Prefers to grow in dappled light (light woodland), along a shady edge or edge of woodland. Growing to 12' (4m); allowing space to flourish. Zone 4b, -22F (-30°C). **(4 gal. – \$40.00)**
46. **R. 'Minas Grand Pré'** - (*catawbiense* x *williamsianum*) A George Swain hybrid. In mid-late spring a profusion of pink bell-shaped flowers in loose trusses grace this Kentville Research Station hybrid. Small oval leaves emerge with a bronze tone and age to dark green. In full sun it forms a perfect dense, compact, mounded dome. Height: 3'. Spread: 3' in 10 years. Zone 5b, -10F (-23C). Everyone should add a few of these in their landscape and it is not commercially available. **(2 gal. – \$35.00)**
47. **R. 'Parker's Pink'** – A Dexter hybrid. Full trusses of stunning large pink flowers with a paler centre and red spotting in mid-late spring. Fragrant & floriferous! Large deep green leaves. Height: 5'. Spread: 5' in 10 years. Zone 5b, -15F (-26C). **(2 gal. – \$35.00; only one available)**
48. **R. 'Percy Wiseman'** - Multi-coloured, funnel-shaped flowers - peach-pink and cream, fading to creamy-white with a yellow throat - in rounded trusses. Very floriferous! Lush glossy dark green foliage. Low, dense, mounded habit. Height: 3'. Spread: 4' in 10 years. Zone 5b, -15°F(-26°C).

49. **R. 'Right Mighty Splendid'** – (*fortunei* x *catalpa*). A huge Cpt. Steele cross. Fragrant pink circa flowers. Mighty big habit! Height: 26ft (8m). **(2 gal. – \$35.00; only one available)**
50. **R. 'Ring's Monarch'** – ('Newburyport Belle' x 'Graf Zeplin'). A Tom Ring hybrid. Beautiful, large, fragrant, pink blooms on a plant with good foliage. Zone 5b, -15°F(-26°C). **(2 gal. – \$35.00)**
51. **R. ('Sandra Hinton' x *falconeri*)** – Has not flowered, but should be gobbled up by Members! Great potential! **(2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)**
52. **R. (*smirnowii* X *falconeri*)** – Has not flowered, but should be gobbled up by Members! Great potential! **(1 gal. – \$30.00; only a few available)**
53. **R. 'Solidarity'** – (*degronianum* ssp. *yakushimanum* x 'The Honourable Jean Marie de Montague'). In mid-spring buds open to large trusses of 12-13 flowers of rich red gradually changing to openly funnel-shaped, wavy edges, purplish-red margins shading to light purplish pink in the throat with purplish-red spots on the dorsal lobe. Leathery, elliptic, matte green leaves (to 5" long). This foliage has indumentum, which can be credited to two of the finest foliage plant parents. A dense and well-shaped habit. Height: 4'. Spread: 6'. Zone 5b, -15F (-26C). **(2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)**
54. **R. 'Swansdown'** – [R. *catawbiense* var. *album* X Belle Heller]. A Leach hybrid. Recipient of the 1982 Award of Excellence from the American Rhododendron Society. A profusion of white flowers, dorsal petal heavily gold flecked that emerge late spring. Fragrant. Green foliage. A rather upright habit- Height: 5'. Spread: 6'. Zone 5a, -20F (-29C) probably colder. As the late Don Craig wrote in his 1993 article, 'Every rhododendron garden needs a good white, Swansdown fills the bill'. **(1 gal. – \$30.00)**
55. **R. 'Taurus'** – ('The Honourable Jean Marie de Montague' x *strigillosum*). In early-mid spring trusses of 16

campanulate flowers are vivid strong-red with a darker throat and black spots on the dorsal lobe. Deep red winter buds. Leaves are elliptic, acute apex, rounded base, about 7" long, very dark green; retained for 3 years. Afternoon sun protection works best for this plant. Height: 8'. Spread: 10'. Zone 6a, -5F (-21C).

56. **R. 'Todmorden'** – [(Pygmalion x *haemotodes*) x Wellfleet] A Dexter hybrid. A beautiful early-flowering with ball-shaped trusses. Flowers are large and bicoloured, edges are bright pink shading to white in the centre. Beautiful dark green foliage. Vigorous, upright-rounded habit. Height: 5'. Spread: 4' in 10 years. Zone 6a, -10F (-23C) Possibly colder. **(2 gal. – \$35.00)**
57. **R. 'Trocadero'** – [Torero x Erato]. A Hachmann hybrid. Large, vivid red trusses open to dark red with black and red markings that emerge late spring. Fragrant! Dark green shiny foliage. A compact habit. Height: 3'. Spread: 4'. Zone 5a, -20F (-29C) possibly colder. **(2 gal. – \$35.00)**
58. **R. *degronianum* ssp. *yakushmanum* 'Koichiro Wada'** – In early to mid-spring rose trusses open to pale-pink flowers that fade to pure white. An exceptionally heavy flowering yak! A superb all-around plant with attractive foliage with a thick coating of orange-brown indumentum. Slow growing, compact habit. Relative heat and cold tolerance. Height: 3'. Spread: 3'. Zone 4a, -25F (-32C). **(2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)**
59. **R. *degronianum* ssp. *yakushmanum* 'Phetteplace'** – Pink to rose-mauve flowers in early to mid-spring. Excellent foliage typical of *yakushmanum*. Height: 4'. Spread: 6'. Zone 7a, 0F (-17.7C) is probably colder given the species. **(2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available)**
60. **R. *yakushmanum* 'Ken Janeck'** – (*degronianum* ssp *yakushmanum* seedling). A Janeck hybrid. In mid-spring rosy-pink buds open to form large apple-blossom pink flowers that fade to white. Long, narrow leaves have a tan-white indumentum. New growth is covered in silver tomentum. Dense foliage covers a plant which is symmetrical and broadly mounded in shape. Slow growing and floriferous. Similar to 'Mist Maiden' but slightly taller in habit. Best in half-day sun and superb for our climate. Height 5'. Spread: 11' in 30 years. Zone 5, -15F (-26C). **(3 gal. – \$40)**
61. **R. *yakushmanum* 'Mist Maiden'** – In mid-spring rosy-pink buds open to form large apple-blossom pink trusses fading to white. Long, narrow leaves with tan-white indumentum. New growth is covered in silver tomentum. Dense foliage covers a plant that is symmetrical and broadly mounded in shape. Slow growing. Height: 4'. Spread: 11' in 30 years. Best in a half-day of sun. A proven performer. Zone 5, -15F (-26C). **(2 gal. – \$35.00)**
62. **R. (*yakushmanum* X *fictolacteum*) X (*brachycarpum* var. *tigerstedtii* X *macabeanum*)** – Has not bloomed yet. Are very uniform and a very compact habit. Should be hardy. We encourage you to research the parentage to get some clues. **(2 gal. – \$35.00)**
63. **R. (*yakushmanum* x 'Moonstone') Minor BPT#78-7A** – A Steele hybrid. Very pale pink flowers quickly fading to creamy white flowers in profusion. Long-lasting bloom! A low, tight mounded habit. Beautiful dark green foliage. A superb plant! Zone 6. **(1 gal. – \$30.00)**
64. **R. *yakushmanum* 'Van Zile'** – Soft pink flowers in mid-spring. Prized for its foliage. Specifically, its long, narrow recurved leaves are heavily coated with silvery-white indumentum and tomentum that persists on new growth over a relatively long season. A rounded, compact form, small growth habit. Height: 2'.

Spread: 3'. Zone 4a, -23.8F (-31C). (*2 gal. – \$35.00; only a few available*)

65. **R. 'Yellow Gate'** – Believed to be a Cowels Hybrid / possibly from Dexter Plantation. Pale-yellow flowers. Good foliage. Possibly Zone 7. (*2 gal. – \$35.00*)

DECIDUOUS AZALEAS (RhodoLand Nursery)

66. **R. 'Arneson Gem'** – Red buds open to large soft yellow-orange flowers with reddish-orange edges open from red buds. Very showy and disease resistant! Small, compact habit. Height: 2'. Spread: 2'. Zone 5a, -20F (-29C) possibly colder. (*2 gal. – \$35.00*)
67. **R. 'Fireball'** – A Dexter hybrid. With classic Azalea fragrance, it explodes with fiery orange-red blooms in early-mid spring. Green foliage emerges bronze and transitions to a fantastic deep bronze fall colour. A compact growth habit. Height: 4'. Spread: 6'. Zone 5a, -20F (-29C) possibly colder. (*2 gal. – \$35.00*)
68. **R. 'Klondyke'** – Exbury hybrid. Buds are a vivid orange and yellow and burst open to brilliant and fragrant golden-yellow flowers. The colour ignites the garden with colour in mid to late spring. Handsome foliage of coppery-red that turns deep bronze in fall. Profuse bloomer and reliably hardy. Height: 6'. Spread: 6'. Zone 5b, -15F (-26C) possibly colder. (*2 gal. – \$35.00*)
69. **R. 'Mandarin Lights'** – (*calendulaceum* x 'Orangeade') A Northern Lights Series hybrid. Ruffled reddish-orange flowers in ball-shaped trusses. Lightly fragrant. Bronze fall colour. Tall upright open habit. Height: 5'. Spread: 4' in 10 years. Very hardy! Zone 3, -35F (-37C). (*2 gal. – \$35.00*)
70. **R. 'Millennium'** – ('Weston's Sparkler' x 'Weston's Parade') A Mezitt hybrid. In mid to late-July flowers are dark pink – almost red, with a pale orange flare. Fragrant! Its blue-green foliage is mildew resistant, turning copper to burgundy in fall. Upright habit. Height: 6'. Spread: 6'. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (*2 gal. – \$35.00*)
71. **R. 'Rosy Lights'** – A Pellett hybrid. In late mid-spring dome-shaped trusses with 8 flowers open to deep purplish pink with vivid reddish orange spotting on dorsal lobe, openly funnel-campanulate, wavy dorsal lobe. Fragrant! Leaves oblanceolate to narrowly elliptic, acute apex, cuneate base, long, flat, bullate, moderate yellowish green. Upright, well-branched habit. Height: 6'. Spread: 6'. Zone 3, -35F (-37C). Very hardy! (*2 gal. – \$35.00*)

OTHER SHRUBS (RhodoLand Nursery)

72. ***Hydrangea quercifolia* 'Queen of Hearts'** – (*H. 'Pee Wee'* x *H. 'Snow Queen'*TM). Comes from the exciting US National Arboretum breeding program in McMinnville, TN. Starts blooming a week or more later than most other *H. quercifolia* with large upright white panicles that slowly age to a deep rose pink. The fall colour is mahogany red. Winter interest includes tan exfoliating bark on older plants. Height: 7'. Spread: 9'. Zone 5. (*2 gal. – \$35.00*)

CONIFERS (Old Rio Nursery)

73. *Abies koreana* ‘**Alpine Star**’ – AKA ‘Alpin Star’. Very dark short needles, silver undersides, and white buds that look like stars. A choice dwarf conifer with upright and irregular to a dense, flat globe growth habit. Eventually becoming more spreading in habit. Slow growing. Ideal for rock gardens. Height: 2’. Spread: 2’ in 10 years. Zone 4b, -22F (-30C). (7” – \$60.00)
74. *Abies koreana* ‘**Ice Breaker**’ – AKA ‘Kohouts Icebreaker’. Jörg Kohout is credited with the origin and introduction. This is a very fine, relatively new, dwarf cultivar of Korean fir. Unique strongly-curved needles showing off the silvery undersides. Branches are short, stubby and radial. Young plants will be globose, in time developing a leader, eventually becoming a small squat pyramidal tree. Typical rate of growth in most areas is 1-3” per year, resulting in a shimmering silvery specimen. American Conifer Society’s 2014 Conifer of the Year. Height: 2’. Spread: 2’ in 10 years. Zone 5, -20F (28.9C). <https://youtu.be/j2-B7d4KgT4> (8x8” – \$85.00)
75. *Abies koreana* ‘**Inga**’ – A hybrid between the Subalpine fir (*lasiocarpa*) and Korean Fir (*koreana*). Its needle-shaped leaves are stunning powder-blue throughout the year. It is an upright, somewhat narrow pyramidal tree; 5-8” of growth per year. Decorative cones adorned in October. Height: 6’. Spread 3’ in 10 years. It prefers humus-rich, nutrient-rich soil in a sunny to partially shaded position. Zone 4, -30F (-34.4 C). (12-15” – \$60.00)
76. *Abies koreana* ‘**Silberzwerg**’ – Miniature silver and green needles. A tendency to become more ovate as it ages, slightly apical. This cultivar makes a fantastic addition to any rock garden. Conifer collectors love this one. Typically grows 1-6” per year. Height: 5’. Spread: 5’ after 10 years. Zone 5, -20F (-28.9C). (7” – \$60.00)
77. *Abies koreana* ‘**Starker's Dwarf**’ – AKA ‘*Abies nordmanniana* ‘Starker's Dwarf’. Originated as a seedling selected in the late 1960s by nurseryman Carl Starker of Jennings Lodge, Oregon who received the original plant from an unknown source in Canada. A slow growing, dwarf, conical selection of Nordmann fir with blunt-tipped, blue-green needles that reveal silvery undersides. Produces good crops of seed cones from a young age. Annual growth of 6-12”. Height: 5-10’ after 10 years. Zone 4, -30 F (-34.4C) (24” – \$60.00)
78. *Abies lasiocarpa* ‘**Hurricane Blue**’ – Stunning silver blue needles. Glows in the winter landscape! A formal, dense pyramidal habit. Annual growth of 6-12”. Prefers organic well-drained soil; naturally grows on sunny slopes. Height: 12’. Spread: 3’ in ten years or more. Zone 5, -20F (-28.9C). (12-15” – \$60.00)
79. *Picea orientalis* ‘**Tom Thumb**’ – Striking golden fingers of tight foliage point out from the centre. The combination of brightly colored needles, extremely slow growth, and a compact nest shape is desirable for a small garden or rock garden. Annual growth of 1-3” per year. Height 1’. Spread: 1.5’ in 10 years. For best colour and to prevent scorching, plant in half-day sun. Zone 4, -30F (-34.4C). (8x6” – \$60.00)
80. *Pinus contorta* ‘**Chief Joseph**’ – Although there is some colour variation depending on location, generally the spring and summer colour is a light yellow-green, transitioning to bright yellow in the fall and winter months. Irregular-upright selection of Lodgepole pine. In colder climates it's a beacon during the winter months. Annual growth of 1-6” per year. Height: 6’. Spread: 3’ in 10 years. Zone 5, -20F (-28.9C). Very difficult to propagate. Very Choice! (8” – \$85.00)
81. *Pinus parviflora* ‘**Kinpo**’ – Tightly-held, short, twisted needles are less than 1” long. Superb bluish foliage has hints of silver and green. Each plant develops a unique low globose to spreading form. Useful in a

highly visible location like at the entrance of a courtyard, in a raised rock garden bed or try as a bonsai. An excellent new variety! Full sun exposure with some salt tolerance. Annual growth of 2-4". Height: 2'. Spread: 3' after 10 years. Zone 5, -20F (-28.9C). **(6-8" – \$60.00)**

82. *Pinus parviflora* '**Regenhold Broom**' – A special dwarf cultivar of Japanese white pine. The needles are a pleasing silvery blue-green, slightly shorter and coarser than those of the species. As they emerge from candles in the spring the needles are rich, burnished gold before maturing to their mature shade. The branchlets are held mostly upright, creating a spreading fastigiata form. Annual growth of 2-3" per year. Height: 5'. Spread: 8' after 10 years. Zone 5, -20F (-28.9C). **(6-8" – \$60.00)**
83. *Sciadopitys verticillata* – Commonly known as Japanese umbrella-pine, as well as コウヤマキ (koya-maki). Rapidly declining in its natural habitat of Japan. A living fossil! Produces two types of needles, some are small, scale-like (5mm long), but the more obvious ones are linear, flat, 8-12cm long and 5-7mm wide, emarginate, dark green above and 2 white bands below, likely will turn light bronze in winter. A narrow, conical crown, but it has a variable growth habit. Once settled in, annual growth can be greater than 12" per year. Height: 12'+ after 10 years. In time it will grow 30-70'. Allow it space to grow into a specimen. Sun to part shade, late afternoon shade in hot areas. Best in rich, moist, acid soils. Zone 5, -20F (-28.9C). **(18-24" – \$75.00)**

JAPANESE MAPLES (Old Rio Nursery)

84. *Acer palmatum* '**Amagi Shigure**' – In early-spring leaves are bright pink-red with deep purple veining. One of the best ghost-like maples with heavy consistent reticulated variegation. Fall colours are bright orange reds. Height: 8-10' in 15 years. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). **(24" – \$55.00)**
85. *Acer palmatum* '**Beni-otake**' – An amazing linearilobum selection by Ed Wood. 'Beni Otake' translates to 'Red bamboo'. Deep burgundy leaves are very thin, long bamboo-like foliage. An upright habit. Height: 15' in 15 years. Very unique! Zone 5, -20F (-29C). **(36-40" – \$55.00)**
86. *Acer palmatum* '**Geisha Gone Wild**' – Found as a variegated sport of 'Geisha'. In spring the leaves emerge with bright pink margined variegation on a deeper red. In full-sun during summer, the leaves may turn to green with cream variegation turning hot-pink to bright purples in fall. When planted in morning sun and afternoon shade the spring pink and red colouration lasts longer into the season. Vase-like growth habit. Height: 7' in 10 years. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). **(20-24" – \$60.00)**
87. *Acer palmatum* '**Hubb's Red Willow**' – Introduced by Dick Wolff of Red Maple Nursery, Pennsylvania. An excellent linearilobum selection! In spring it leaves out showing bright red string-like leaves. As the leaf matures it widens slightly and changes to a deeper maroon, turning to a brilliant shade of crimson-red in fall. Extremely vigorous in growth habit. Height: 10-12' in 10 years. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). **(30-36" – \$55.00)**
88. *Acer palmatum* '**Japanese Princess**' – An exquisite new selection by Talon Buchholz. In spring leaves emerge hot pink to coral depending on the year. The colour fades to a green, turning to bright red in fall. Dwarf and layering in habit. A nice textured specimen in time! Height: 4' in 15 years. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). **(12-16" – \$60.00)**

89. *Acer palmatum* 'Kinshi' – Green thread-like foliage in spring. 'Kinshi' translates as "with golden threads", which describes the excellent yellow to orange fall colour. A small upright habit. Height: 6-8' in 10 years. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). Excellent specimen in time! (20-24" – \$55.00)
90. *Acer palmatum* 'Mikawa Yatsubusa' – Green foliage emerges in spring. Leaves are bright chartreuse green with a red sheath to the petiole creating an extremely beautiful layering effect. Fall colour is a bright fiery-red. A tightly layering dwarf, slow growing habit . Height: 5' in 15 years. Heat tolerant and overall a very hardy tree. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (14-18" – \$55.00)
91. *Acer palmatum* 'Mikazuki' – 'Mikazuki' translates as 'crescent moon'. Leaves emerge in spring with extremely appealing bright pink-red, accented by deep reddish purple veining that gives a great contrast to the leaf. Each leaf is heavily divided! By mid-summer leaves will turn to greenish-cream accented by deep-green veining, then turning bright golden yellows to oranges in fall. Height: 10'. Spread: 7' in 15 years. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (24-30" – \$55.00)
92. *Acer palmatum* 'Miwa' – "mi" means beauty, while "wa" means peaceful. A Talon Buchholz introduction. In spring leaves emerge green with creamy like variegation possibly with a yellow to pink blush. This provides a striking contrast with the dark green veins of the reticulated leaves. Fall colour typically starts out as a yellow, maturing to oranges, reds, and purples. Height: 10' in 15 years. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (24-30" – \$55.00)
93. *Acer palmatum* 'Ojishi' – Leaves emerge heavily crinkled and twisted chartreuse green. As it matures it turns a rich green by late spring. Turns bright yellows before becoming infused with orange in fall. Dwarf habit. Open habit grown in shade, more extreme dense habit when grown in full sun. Older growth is twisted, flatten outs much more than the new growth. Height: 6' in 15 years. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (12"-16" – \$55.00)
94. *Acer palmatum* 'Peve Starfish' – A Piet Vergeldt introduction. Unique leaves cup downward giving the appearance of a "starfish". In spring leaves emerge bright red, maturing to a deep maroon. New flushes of growth bright red. In fall it will light up your landscape turning to a bright crimson red. A mid-sized dwarf habit. Height: 8' in 20 years. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (30" – \$55.00)
95. *Acer palmatum* 'Rainbow' – In spring the leaves emerge a brighter red with a reddish pink variegation. The 'rainbow' colouring quickly becomes a black red with hot pink variegation. Deeply divided large leaves make it spectacular! Any branches not showing pink variegation should be pruned. Foliage turns to a brighter red in the fall. Height: 8' in 10 years. Plant in morning-sun, with protection from the hot afternoon sun for best display of colour. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (30-36" – \$55.00)
96. *Acer palmatum* 'Rhode Island Red' – In spring large leaves emerge bright red turning to a deep maroon. Displays bright fiery red colour in fall. Dwarf and very dense in habit with lots of horizontal branching. This gives a shape similar to the mounding laceleaf types with a larger fuller leaf. Height: 5'. Spread: 7'. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). A statement plant! (40" – \$55.00)
97. *Acer palmatum* 'Ruby Stars' – AKA 'Beni hoshi'. A Del Loucks introduction. In spring, displays of full rounded amomenum leaves are bright red, fading to a deeper maroon, then turning a peachy-orange in mid-summer. As leaves mature they become more rounded and slightly twist giving a very unique habit. Fall colours are bright yellow to orange. Dwarf, upright in habit. Height: 5'. Spread: 4' in 15 years. Protection from the hot afternoon sun is recommended to get the full twist on each leaf. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (12-15" – \$55.00)

98. *Acer palmatum* 'Shishigashira' – Crinkled deep-green leaves throughout the entire summer. An amazing fall show of deep yellows and golden shades with hints of red and orange. Unique growth habit is very dense branching with a widening effect midway up on mature trees. Height: 12' over time. Consistently grows larger in filtered light. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (24-30" – \$55.00)
99. *Acer palmatum* 'Skeeter's Broom' – In spring, leaves come out as a bright red before maturing to maroon. Bright fire engine red fall foliage. Uniquely larger growing with a dense compact habit and a narrow garden footprint. Height: 15'. Spread: 6' in 15 years. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). Provides much colour in the landscape! (20-24" – \$55.00)
100. *Acer palmatum* 'Twombly's Red Sentinel' – A Ken Twombly selection. In early spring leaves emerge bright red, maturing to a deeper maroon by summer. In autumn, the electric red fall colour is stunning in the landscape. Remains tall and upright, a fairly narrow habit. Height: 10'. Spread: 3' in 15 years. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (24-30" – \$55.00)

OTHER TREES (Old Rio Nursery)

101. *Cornus kousa* 'Greensleeves' – Attractive foliage and excellent bloom production! In early summer, star-shaped white bracts with a greenish hue cover the tree. The glossy, deep green foliage turns red-purple in fall. A delightful addition to the woodland garden or edge of woodland. Height: 15-20'. Spread: 15-20'. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (5ft – \$125.00)
102. *Cornus kousa* 'Summer Gold' - Exceptional foliage! In early-spring its leaves display a golden edge, and by mid-summer stripes and swatches of pink give the foliage a water-colored appearance. In mid to late-spring, expect creamy-white bracts with incredible staying power. In fall, leaves turn a vivid red. A multi-season performer! A very compact growth habit. Height: 8-10'. Spread: 4-6'. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (4ft – \$125.00)
103. *Cornus kousa* 'Summer Fun' – Flashy variegated leaves sport white edges, framing clean green centres. In late-spring radiant white bracts make this lively dogwood stand out. Leaves change colour in fall to shades of red, orange, and bright pink. Unique bark adds winter interest. Height: 10-16'. Spread: 10-15'. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (3ft – \$115.00)
104. *Cornus kousa* 'Scarlet Fire' – An introduction from Rutgers. Its 5" dark pink and fuchsia bracts last 6-8 weeks standing up well in sunny, warm weather. New leaf growth is tinged with purple and dark green leaves turn red in the fall. Floriferous and moderately vigorous tree. In the summer, it develops small pink-red fruits that add interest. It flowers heavily at 2-4 years! Height: 12'. Spread: 8' in 10 years. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). (4ft – \$125.00)
105. *Ginkgo biloba* 'Jehoshaphat' – Delightful fan-shaped yellow leaves in the spring, turning to light green, then yellow again in fall. Dwarf tree with an irregular upright habit. Does best in full sun. Height: 9' in 20+ years. Zone 4, -30F (34.4C). (12" – \$60.00)
106. *Quercus rubra* 'Greg's Variegated' – A rare variegated selection by plantsman Greg Williams and unofficially named by Talon Buchholz. Splendid rich green foliage is generously spattered with white specks and patches as the white variegation is more concentrated toward the leaf edges. In fall the tree displays orange-yellow tones, but is flecked with white, cream, rust and red. Typical upright form of *Quercus rubra* with an annual growth rate of 12-18". Height: 20-25' in 15 years. Zone 3. (16-24" – \$85.00)

107. **Magnolia ‘Daybreak’** – A stunning, delightfully fragrant, multi-coloured hybrid offering bright tones of magenta, mid pink, light pink, and salmon. When the flowers are fully open, the dark pink reverses and light pink inner sides of the petals contrast beautifully. It blooms late enough that it is rarely affected by frosts. Height: 20-30’. Spread: 15-20’. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). **(3ft not budded – \$75.00)**
108. **Magnolia ‘Elizabeth’** – (*M. acuminata* x *M. denudata*). Flowers abundantly! The fragrant 3” wide light yellow flowers have tinges of yellow-green near the base of each flower, and cover the tree in late March to early April. Annual growth rate of 12”. Height: 30’. Spread: 15-30’. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). **(3-4ft budded – \$105.00)**
109. **Magnolia X ‘Galaxy’** – (*M. liliiflora* ‘Nigra’ x *M. sprengeri* ‘Diva’). In late April, escaping late spring frosts a profusion of extra-large (15-30cm across) flowers that are cup-shaped open and are almost star-shaped with 12 wide tepals when mature. Bright purple-pink outside and almost white inside. Very fragrant! Blooming period of up to 6 weeks. The deciduous tree is rather impressive when blooming is at its peak. A strong single-stemmed mid-sized tree with a thick leader, forming dense, oval to pyramidal shaped canopy with 18-20cm long leaves; ovate, mid green with some glaucous hues underneath. Height: 30-35’. Spread: 15-20’. Zone 4, -30F (34.4C). **(3ft budded – \$105.00)**
110. **Magnolia ‘Honey Tulip’** - A Mark Jury hybrid. Magnificent display of 6 inch golden-honey, goblet-shaped flowers in late March to early April before dark green leaves (15cm long) emerge. Small, upright, deciduous tree. Height: 10-15’. Spread” 8-12’ in time. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). Requires shelter from strong winds. Very choice! **(3-4ft light budded – \$75.00)**
111. **Magnolia ‘Judy Zuk’** – In early to mid-spring, 7-9" tulip-shaped, yellow flowers with a plum base, fill the air with fragrance. Throughout the growing season, this deciduous tree has ovate, medium green, leathery leaves that turn yellow in the fall. Attractive upright habit. Height: 10-15’. Spread: 8-12’. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). Requires shelter from strong winds. **(3ft not budded – \$75.00)**
112. **Magnolia x loebneri ‘White Rose’** – (*M. kobus* x *M. stellata*). Flowers open before the leaves unfold in late-March to early-April, dark pink in bud, opening white, flushed with pink. Valued as a precocious bloomer! Leaves are dark green, somewhat wider toward the tips than at the base. Fall colour is yellow. A large deciduous shrub to small tree, usually multi-stemmed or branched low to the ground. Height: 15-20’. Spread: 15-20’. Full sun, rich, moist, well-drained soil. Zone 4, -23.8F (-31C). **(3ft budded – \$105.00)**
113. **Magnolia ‘Tinkerbell’** – In early spring, buds open to numerous dark magenta, 3" upright flowers with pale pink interiors and a very sweet fragrance. It is sought after for cut flower production in Europe. Vigorous branching habit. Height: 10-15’. Spread: 6-8'. Zone 5, -20F (-29C). **(3ft not budded – \$75.00)**

HEATHS AND HEATHERS (The Heather Farm)

114. **Calluna vulgaris ‘Amanda’** - Bud-bloomer. Pretty dark-pink buds are enjoyed from August to November. The foliage is mid-green. A bushy, upright habit. Height: 12”; Width: 16”. Zone 4. **(9cm pot - \$12.50; only a few available)**
115. **Calluna vulgaris ‘Angie’** - New variety of Bud-bloomer. Laden deep crimson buds are thrilling from September to November. The foliage is dark green. Height: 20"; Width: 24". Zone 4. **(9cm pot - \$12.50; only a few available)**

PERENNIALS (Insigne)

152. *Aconitum fischeri* (**Monkshood**) – A fall-blooming species with large dark violet-blue flowers on strong stems to 3' (.9m) or more high. Attractive, glossy dark green dissected foliage. Usually doesn't require staking. Best in moist well-drained soil in full sun or part shade. Zone 4. **(6" Dp Pot – \$15.00)**
153. *Aconitum japonicum* (**Japanese Monkshood**) – A perennial species with an upright-arching habit. Pale lavender-blue flowers are born in clusters along the stems in late-summer/early autumn. Grows 2-3' (60-90cm) high. Sun to part shade in rich well-drained soil. Requires little to no staking. Zone 5. **(4" Dp Pot – \$10.00)**
154. *Actaea spicata* (**Baneberry**) – Attractive foliage is topped by panicles of fragrant creamy white flowers in late spring and followed by clusters of glossy black berries. Part to full shade in well-drained soil. Foliage to 18" (45cm) high. To 30" (75cm) high in fruit and flower. Fruit is poisonous. An herbaceous perennial closely related to Cimicifugas. Zone 4/5. **(3.5" Pot – \$5.00)**
155. *Agapanthus praecox/hybrid?* – (TENDER) A large evergreen variety with broad foliage and medium blue flowers. For tub culture stored frost-free in winter although I have overwintered and flower it against a foundation protected by a bale of straw (although no evergreen). **(2 gal. – \$15.00)**
156. *Anemone nemerosa* (**Blue Wood Anemone**) - A rhizomatous perennial for rich, loose soil in part shade. Blue flowers are born in early spring above dissected dark green foliage. To 8" (20cm) high. Goes dormant in summer. Zone 5. **(3.5" Pot – \$5.00)**
157. *Anemone ranunculoides* (**Yellow Wood Anemone**) – A deciduous rhizomatous perennial for part or deciduous shade. Its bright golden yellow anemone flowers are born above dissected dark green foliage in spring. Best in loose, rich soil. Grows 6-8" (15-20cm) high spreading to form a loose clump. Goes dormant in summer. Zone 5. The type species is a single-flowered variety. **(3.5" Pot – \$6.00)**
158. *Anthericum liliago* (**St. Bernard's Lily**) – Small lily-like starry white flowers are born on unbranched spikes in summer. Arching grass-like green foliage adds texture to the perennial border throughout the growing season. Grows 18-24" (45-60cm) tall in bloom. For full sun with good drainage. Little known and seldom offered but very charming. Zone 6. Note that there may be a few *Paradisialia liliastrum* mixed in with these. **(4" Dp Pot – \$8.00)**
159. *Asarum caudatum* (**Western Hardy Ginger**) - A deciduous species which spreads quickly, forming a dense, lush groundcover. Its large heart-shaped leaves are dark shiny green and are covered with fine hairs. Reddish brown flowers held beneath the foliage. Makes an excellent foil for plants with dark foliage. To 6" (15cm) high. Part to dense shade. The foliage of asarums when crushed smells like ginger thus the common name. Zone 6. **(4" Pot – \$8.00)**
160. *Asarum caudigerum ssp. cardiophyllum* - (TENDER) A rare species which is likely only hardy to Zone 7 or 8. Its thick, almost succulent, leathery evergreen leaves are dark green and mottled with silver. Very striking. **(1 gal. – \$18.00)**
161. *Asarum europaeum* (**European Hardy Ginger**) - A semi-evergreen clumping species, forming large lush mounds or mats in time. Its leaves are kidney-shaped, fleshy, and rich dark glossy green. Small, greenish-red flowers are hidden beneath the foliage. Grows 6-8" (15-20cm) high. Shade to part shade. The

foliage of asarums when crushed smells like ginger thus the common name. Zone 5. These are generous full pots. **(4" Pot – \$8.00)**

162. *Asarum hartwegii* (**Hartweg's Wild Ginger**) – A beautiful species with dark green leaves mottled silver similar to a cyclamen. Flowers are intermediate in size between *A. europeum* and *A. caudatum*. Semi-evergreen. Protect from slugs! Zone 6. **(2.5" Pot – \$6.00)**
163. *Asparagus tenuifolius* - A seldom encountered ornamental species growing to 30"(.75m) tall with arching branched stems of fine-feathery foliage. Forms dense clumps. Full sun. Zone 5. **(4" Dp Pot – \$10.00)**
164. *Astilbe glaberrima* - A dwarf species with soft pink flowers and dark green foliage. Grows only 6-8"(15-20cm) high. **(3.5" Pot – \$8.00)**
165. *Athyrium grammitoides* - A hardy and apparently rare in cultivation fern which may or may not have another half dozen other names. I'll stick to this one as any research I've done has left me more confused. This is a dense colony forming deciduous species with thin stems. Forms clumps 8-12"(.2-.3m) high. Resents drought - it will go dormant at the first sign of it. Shade to part shade. Zone 5, possibly colder. **(4" – \$12.00)**
166. *Campanula persicifolia* **Semi-Double White Form** - (Semi-Double White Peach-leaved Bellflower) A semi-double white form of this common perennial. Flowers extend 3'(.9m) above the matt-forming rosettes of dark green foliage. Long-blooming. Sun to part shade. May need staking. Zone 5. **(4" Pot – \$6.00)**
167. *Campanula rotundifolia* (**Common Harebell**) - Small bell-shaped blue-violet flowers on wiry stems. Grows 6-10"(15-25cm) tall. Full sun. **(3.5" Pot – \$6.00)**
168. *Cardamine pentaphylla* – Mauve-pink flowers top this species. Grows to 12"(30cm) tall. Summer dormant. **(4" Dp Pot – \$10.00)**
169. *Corydalis cheilanthifolius* - An easy semi-evergreen species with rosettes of finely dissected fern-like foliage and spikes of many tubular bright yellow flowers in late spring. Not summer dormant. Sun to part shade. To 12"(.3m) high. Zone 5. **(4" Dp Pot – \$7.00)**
170. *Digitalis grandiflora* (**Yellow Foxglove**) - A reliably perennial species with spikes of creamy-yellow flowers in summer. Remove spent flowers to encourage rebloom. To 2'(60cm) tall, usually less. Sun to part shade. Zone 4. **(4" Dp Pot – \$7.00)**
171. *Diphylleia cymosa* (**Umbrella Leaf**) - A large bold-leaved perennial for moist part-shade. Rounded palmate leaves grow 12-16"(30-40cm) in diameter and are borne two to a stem. Umbels of white flowers are carried above the foliage developing into blue berries. Clump forming. To 42" (1.05m) tall. Zone 5. **(3.5" Pot – \$6.00)**
172. *Dodecatheon meadia* (**Shooting Star**) - Charming spring blooming perennial for part shade in well-drained soil. Umbels of pale lavender flowers with reflexed petals above basal rosettes of foliage. Summer dormant. Zone 5. **(3.5" Pot – \$6.00)**
173. *Epimedium pauciflora* - This species resembles *E. pauciflorum* in foliage and habit, growing to only 6"(15cm) tall and forming a dense matt. Diminutive flowers are pale lavender-pink and more typical of the species. Cut old foliage back in early spring before new growth begins. Zone 6. **(4" Pot – \$9.00)**

174. ***Gentiana asclepiadea* ‘Alba’ (White Willow Gentian)** - A clump forming herbaceous perennial with arching stems to 2’(6m) high. White trumpet-shaped flowers appear from the leaf axils in late summer. Plant in part-shade in well-drained moist soil. Dislikes disturbance. Zone 5. These are seed grown and the odd one may bloom blue. **(4” Dp Pot – \$8.00)**
175. ***Geranium* ‘Philippe Vapelle’** - A mounding- clumping cultivar with heavily textured felted grey-green leaves. Flowers are blue-purple flowers with darker veining. Blooms in late spring. Sun to part-shade. Zone 5. **(4” Dp Pot – \$9.00)**
176. ***Geranium pratense*** - A violet blue species similar to ‘Johnson’s Blue’. Cut back after initial flowering for a more compact habit. Zone 5. **(6” Dp Pot – \$10.00)**
177. ***Geranium renardii*** - A mounding-clumping species with grey-green leaves that are heavily textured and felted. Flowers are white with purple veining. Blooms in late spring. Sun to part-shade. Zone 5. **(6” Pot – \$15.00)**
178. ***Helleborus croaticus*** - A species hellebore similar in appearance to *H. torquatus*. Flowers are pale green flushed with purple on the outside. Beautiful finely dissected foliage. Deciduous. Zone 5. To 16” high. Plants are grown from hand-pollinated seeds but there is a chance they may not be true. **(2.5” Pot – \$5.00)**
179. ***Helleborus purpurascens*** – A deciduous species with reddish-purple flowers with a green undertone. To 16”(40cm) high. Zone 5. Plants are grown from hand- pollinated seeds but there is a chance they may not be true. **(2.5” Pot – \$5.00)**
180. ***Helleborus torquatus*** - A species hellebore lovely narrow deeply dissected foliage. Smaller flowers are green flushed with purple-red. Zone 5. Plants grown from hand-pollinated seeds with a chance they may not be true. **(2.5” Pot – \$5.00)**
181. ***Helleborus viridis ssp. occidentalis*** – A deciduous species with small pale green flowers. Grows 12-16”(30-40cm) tall. Zone 6, possibly colder. **(2.5” Pot – \$5.00)**
182. ***Helleborus x hybridus (x orientalis)* (Lenten Rose)** - An elegant and aristocratic early spring blooming perennial. Flower colour covers a broad spectrum - whites, pinks, yellows, greens, burgundy, dusty purples & near blacks, etc. - often with contrasting spotting and veining. The flowers are carried, several to a stem, above glossy, leathery, deep green dissected evergreen foliage. Blooming commences very early in spring, shortly after the ground thaws, lasting a long period. Petals gradually fade in colour but remain intact well into the summer as the seed pods inflate and the seeds develop. Plant height in flower ranges from 12-18”(30-45cm). Plant in light shade in well-drained soil. Tolerant of acidic soil but prefers an alkaline soil. Prepare the soil extra deep with plenty of compost and well-rotted manure added. Resents transplanting. Old foliage may be removed before flowering if winter-damaged. Top dress annually with well-rotted manure. Zone 4. These are seed-grown from superior plants. Where indicated as ”ex”, colours indicate the seed parent and will not necessarily come true.

Needs loose well drained soil with plenty of organic material and an annual light top dressing of lime or bone-meal. Zone 5. **(3.5" Pot – \$7.00)**
184. *Hosta species* **cw Japan (DA)** - Possibly a form of *H. gracillima*. A dwarf species with narrow lance-shaped foliage less than an inch (2.5cm) wide. Forms a dense almost spikey mound to 6"(15cm) high with a multitude of short flower scapes bearing lavender flowers. **(4" Dp Pot – \$8.00)**
185. *Hosta* **cv. "Narrow Leaf/Long Petiole"** - A smaller cultivar with long skinny leaves and petioles growing to 8"(20cm) high. **(6" Dp Pot – \$10.00)**
186. *Iris cristata* (**Dwarf Crested Iris**) - A charming rhizomatous iris species growing only 4-6"(10-15cm) high and forming a dense mat. Large lavender-blue flowers are born in spring just above the short broad foliage. Sun to part shade in moist, well-drained soil. Grow on the lean side for better flowering. Zone 4/5. **(4" Dp Pot – \$7.00)**
187. *Iris cristata* **Dwarf Form (Super-Dwarf Crested Iris)** - A diminutive form half the typical size in both flower and foliage. Mistakenly offered as *Iris verna* in the past. **(3.5" Pot – \$7.00)**
188. *Iris sibirica* **'Caesar's Brother'?? (Caesar's Brother Siberian Iris)** - A cultivar I received mislabeled which appears identical to 'Caesar's Brother'. Dark purple flowers to 40"(100cm) tall. Zone 5. **(6" Dp Pot – \$10.00)**
189. *Iris wilsonii* - A Siberian-type iris with soft yellow flowers spotted brown and born two to a stalk. Early blooming to 24"(60cm) high. Foliage is narrow and glaucous blue-green. Best in full sun in well-drained moist soil. Enjoys extra moisture during bloom time. Much easier to grow than the similar *I. forrestii*. Zone 6. **(4" Dp Pot – \$10.00)**
190. *Jeffersonia diphylla* (**Twinleaf**) - A choice early spring-blooming woodland perennial with up-facing pure white flowers. Taller-growing than its Asian counterpart, growing to 16"(40cm) tall. Zone 5. **(3.5" Pot – \$8.00)**
191. *Lathyrus vernus* **'Roseus' (Spring Vetchling)** – Soft-pink sweet pea-like flowers appear in early spring on this mounding perennial to 1'(30cm) high. For moist well-drained soil in part-shade. Zone 5. **(3.5" Pot – \$6.00)**
192. *Liriope spicata* (**Creeping Lilyturf**) - A spreading evergreen groundcover for sun to part shade. Long thin strap-like arching foliage is lush and rich dark green forming a 4"(10cm) high mat. 12"(30cm) spikes of fluffy pale pink flowers appear in late summer. Cut back in early spring before the new leaves emerge. Zone 5. **(3.5" Pot – \$6.00)**
193. *Lysimachia paridiformis* **var. stenophylla JN0918** – An unusual and striking species with whorls of dark green glossy foliage. Its golden yellow flowers sit in a tight dome on top of the foliage. This is a superior collection by Jens Nielsen which grows to 18"(45cm) tall and is purported to be hardier. For part shade in moist but not waterlogged soil. Zone 7. Should survive here with some protection. **(3.5" Pot – \$15.00)**
194. *Pachyphragma macrophyllum* – Closely related to Cardamines, this woodland ground cover featured rounded and ruffled dark green semi-evergreen foliage topped with dome-shaped heads for white flowers in

spring. Grows 12-16”(30-40cm) tall in flower. For part shade and tolerant of drier soils. Zone 6, probably colder. **(4” Dp Pot – \$7.00)**

195. ***Paris quadrifolia*** - The easiest species to grow of this trillium relative. Similar to a trillium but in this species it has a whorl of 4 leaves. The curious solitary flowers consist of 4 or more thread-like upright green petals held above a whorl of green sepals. Flowers are followed by decorative black berry-like fruit. To 10”(25cm) high. Spreads stoloniferously forming large clumps. Cultivation as per trilliums. Zone 6, possibly Colder. **(4” Dp Pot – \$10.00)**
196. ***Phlox stolonifera* ‘Sherwood Purple’** - A creeping mat-forming woodland species. Its fragrant purple flowers are borne on 8”(20cm) stems above the foliage. Spring-blooming. For moist well-drained soil in sun to part-shade. Cut back after flowering. Zone 4. **(3.5” Pot – \$5.00)**
197. ***Podophyllum delavayi x versipelle*** - Hybrids with dark red long-petalled pendulous flowers. Lobed foliage is intermediate between the two species and emerges with varying bronze mottling. Taller growing than the mother. For part shade in rich moist well-drained soil. Zone 6. **(1 gal. – \$25.00)**
198. ***Podophyllum mairei* ‘Green Mile’** - Similar to *P. pleianthum* and *P. versipelle* but with cup-shaped pendulous flowers that are pinkish-red to dark red. Large dark green leaves have pointed-rounded shallow lobes and undulating margins. Leaves can grow to 18”(45cm) across or more! Grows to 24”(60cm) high or more. For part shade in rich moist well-drained soil. Zone 6. **(3” Dp Pot – \$9.00)**
199. ***Podophyllum mairei* hybrid?** - Possibly a hybrid. As per above but leaves more deeply lobed. Zone 6. **(6” Dp Pot – \$16.00)**
200. ***Podophyllum pleianthum x versipelle*** - These are similar to *P. pleianthum* but with deeper and more rounded lobes. Dark red long-petaled pendulous flowers. For part shade in rich moist well-drained soil. Grows to 3’(90cm) high or more. Zone 6. **(3” Dp Pot – \$9.00)**
201. ***Polygonatum filipes*** - A low-growing species to only 12”(30cm) tall. Clusters of pendulous narrow greenish-white tipped green flowers dangle from the leaf axils. Part-shade to shade. Zone 6. **(4” Dp Pot – \$8.00)**
202. ***Polygonatum humile* (Dwarf Solomon’s Seal)** - A cute dwarf stoloniferous species growing only 6-8”(15-20cm) high. Creamy-white flowers tipped with green are borne solitarily in the leaf axils. Shade to part-shade. Great as a groundcover. Zone 5. **(4” Dp Pot – \$8.00)**
203. ***Polygonatum* species – biflorum/pubescens??** - A low growing species growing about a foot tall with green-tinged flowers. Zone 5. **(6” Dp Pot – \$10.00)**
204. ***Primula marginata* ‘Dwarf Form’** - A compact form of this beautiful alpine species with finely-toothed leaves covered in white farina. Lavender-blue flowers are borne in early spring. Given good drainage it will thrive in troughs, screes and rock gardens. Prefers alkaline soils. Zone 5. **(3.5” Pot – \$8.00)**
205. ***Roscoea auriculata*** - Orchid-like bright purple flowers are born above stalks of narrow corn-like foliage in late summer. Grows to 24”(60cm) tall. Plant deeply in rich well-drained soil in sun to light shade. Borderline hardy to Zone 6 - mulch heavily in winter. **(4” Dp Pot – \$12.00)**
206. ***Roscoea auriculata* ex ‘Floriade’** - Seedlings of this larger flowered cultivar. **(6” Dp Pot – \$15.00)**

207. *Roscoea cauleyoides* - Orchid-like creamy-yellow flowers are born above stalks of narrow corn-like foliage in late summer. Grows to 24”(60cm) tall. Plant deeply in rich well-drained soil in sun to light shade. Borderline hardy to Zone 6 - mulch heavily in winter. **(6” Dp Pot – \$15.00)**
208. *Roscoea purpurea* ‘**Spice Island**’ – A beautiful cultivar with exotic-looking stout dark red stalks and narrow dark green leaves with dark red undersides. Orchid-like flowers are lavender-pink with a reddish reverse to the upper petal and are born in succession in late summer. Grows to 18”(45cm) tall. Plant deeply in rich well-drained soil in sun to light shade. Borderline hardy to Zone 6 - mulch heavily in winter. **(6” Dp Pot – \$15.00)**
209. *Roscoea purpurea* ex **Red Gurkha seedlings sibbed** – Seedlings of selected flowered selections of the species. Note colours on the availability list. Colours vary from red-orange to purple to pink. **(6” Dp Pot – \$15.00)**
210. *Saruma henryi* – A monotypic genus closely related to asarums - its name is an anagram. Growing to 20”(50cm) tall, it has large, heart-shaped leaves that are heavily felted. Unlike asarums, its ¾”(2 cm) primrose yellow flowers are held above the plant and are borne from late spring until mid-summer. Deciduous. Zone 6. **(4” Dp Pot – \$10.00)**
211. *Saxifraga veitchiana* - A evergreen groundcover species for shade to part-shade which spreads by runners like a strawberry. Coin-sized rounded foliage with scalloped edges in basal rosettes from which sprays of delicate white flowers emerge in summer. Zone 6b. **(3.5” Pot – \$5.00)**
212. *Sempervivum* ‘**Sprite**’ – **(4” Pot – \$6.00)**
213. *Sempervivum* Mixed – **(4” Pot – \$6.00)**
214. *Stylophorum diphyllum* - 2”(5cm) golden yellow poppy-like flowers from late spring to early summer. Part shade to shade in moist well-drained soil. To 16”(40cm) high. Cut back after blooming to rejuvenate foliage. Zone 5. **(3.5” Pot – \$7.00)**
215. *Tellima grandiflora* - A close relative and very similar to heucheras. Forms a mound of hairy medium-green leaves similar in shape to tiarellas. Unique, small fringed green flowers are born on spikes to 24”(60cm) high. The fringes of the flowers redden with age. Part-shade to shade. Great for the flower arranger. Zone 6. **(3.5” pot - \$7.00)**
216. *Uvularia sessilifolia* - A lower growing species to 16”(4m) tall with pendulous pale yellow flowers with a long slender tubular shape and recurved tips. Spreads stoloniferously. For the woodland garden in moist well-drained soil. Zone 5. **(3.5” pot - \$6.00)**
217. *Uvularia grandifolia* - */perfoliata* mixed – (Merrybells) Charming woodland perennial with pendulous yellow narrow bell-shaped flowers with twisted petals. The flowers are born in early spring as the foliage unfurls. Upright arching stems with alternate foliage. Grows 18-24”(.45-.6m) tall forming a dense clump. These two species differ mainly in the colouring of their yellow flowers. Zone 5. **(3.5” pot - \$6.00)**
218. *Viola variegata* - Dainty silvery-grey variegated foliage and purple flowers. Seeds about mildly. Zone 6. **(3.5” pot - \$4.00)**

219. *Waldsteinia ternata* (**Barren Strawberry**) - A groundcover with bright yellow strawberry-like flowers. Foliage spreads like and resembles strawberries. Sun to part-shade. Zone 5. (4" Dp pot - \$8.00)

BULBS (Insigne)

220. *Acis (Leucojum) autumnalis* (**Autumn Snowflake**) - A charming diminutive bulb with small fringed white bells in late summer and early fall above dark green grass-like foliage. Usually listed as Zone 7 and I've tried for years to establish planted bulbs without success. It has however seeded itself under a Dwarf Japanese Garden Juniper where it has survived happily for the past 10 years - perhaps a clue to its success. (3.5" pot - \$6.00; 6 bulbs)
221. *Allium cernuum* - (Nodding Onion) Loose umbels of nodding pale pink flowers are borne on 12"(30cm) stems in early summer. Sun to part shade. Goes dormant in late summer. Zone 3. (4" Dp pot - \$7.00; several bulbs)
222. *Allium jesdianum* 'Akbulak' - A drumstick type allium with 4-5"; ball-shaped umbels of rich dark red-purple flowers with white stamens. Late spring blooming. To 32"(80cm) tall. Summer dormant. Zone 5. (4" Dp pot - \$7.00; 6 bulbs)
223. *Allium pskemense* - An unusual species with thick hollow blue-grey leaves grown more for its foliage than its flowers. Flowers are white held in a dense rounded head. Edible but slow to increase. To 36"(90cm) tall. Zone 6. (3.5" pot - \$6.00)
224. *Allium zebdanense* - A graceful species with clusters of pure white flowers atop thin stems to 16"(40cm) tall. Sun or shade. Zone 6. (3.5" pot - \$6.00; 12 bulbs)
225. *Amorphophallus konjac* - **TENDER** A dramatic aroid which sports a single mottled stalk to 4'(1.2m) high with an umbrella of dissected leaflets to 24"(60cm) long radiating from the top. When the corm gets big enough it will occasionally send up a flower stalk topped with a dark purple-red flower to 24"(60cm) high. Flowers before the foliage emerges. Rated hardy to Zone 6 but I have never succeeded in overwintering it in our climate. Best to lift corm in the fall and store cool and dry over winter. Soil needs to be warm before growth commences - plant indoors in spring and move outdoors once growth has started. (3" bulb - \$25.00)
226. *Arisaema ciliatum v. liubaense* - The narrow leaflets of this species are held in parasol fashion. Flowers are purple-red with creamy-green stripes. Part-shade in rich well-drained soil. Zone 5. (3.5" pot - \$9.00; 7/8 bulb)
227. *Arisaema jacquemontii* - A smaller-growing species with leaves made up of 5-7 broad leaflets. Slender green flowers with pale veins. Grows 18"(45cm) tall. Part-shade in rich well-drained soil. Zone 6. (2.5" pot - \$6.00; 5/8 bulb)
228. *Arum dioscoridis* - An aroid with arrow-shaped trifoliate leaves to 13"(30cm) long in fall. Black-purple to greenish with purple-black spots in spring as the foliage goes dormant. Poisonous. Gloves should be worn when handling as it can cause severe rashes in some people. **TENDER** (3.5" pot - \$10.00)
229. *Cyclamen hederifolium* - Fall-blooming - flowers usually pink to lavender pink and occasionally white, with a darker 'nose'. Leaves vary from ivy-shaped to very elongated and from almost all green to almost all

silver with various patterns in between. Summer dormant. These are grown from select but not particularly forms so probably best grown in pots. (4" Dp pot - \$10.00)

230. *Cyclamen purpurascens* - The most reliably hardy species for us. Requires rich loose well-drained soil in part-shade. Does not go dormant so should not get too dry in summer. Fall blooming. Flowers are usually pink. Evergreen foliage is dark green, usually patterned with silver. Zone 6, possibly colder. (3.5" pot - \$9.00)
231. *Erythronium dens-canis* (Dog Tooth Violet) – Mauve-pink flowers with recurved petals are held above a pair of leaves that are heavily mottled with bronze. Early spring blooming. Part-shade. Zone 4. (4" pot - \$8.00; 3 bulbs)
232. *Fritillaria camschatcensis* - Near-black heavily textured bell-shaped flowers are born atop stems growing to 24"(60cm) tall. Lily-like foliage in whorls. Spring blooming. Well-drained, moist soil in sun to part-shade. Zone 4. (4" Dp pot - \$10.00; 3 bulbs)
233. *Hedychium coccineum* 'Tara'? (Tara Ginger Lily) – TENDER? A genus of plants reminiscent of Cannas. Stems of narrow canna-like dark green foliage are topped by dense spikes of pale orange-salmon flowers in summer. May be hardy in Zone 6 with protection but can be grown in containers or lifted and potted in the fall and stored cold but frost-free. Grows to 4'(1.2m) high. Full sun. (2 gal. - \$15.00)
234. *Iris bucharica* (Corn-leaf Iris) – A surprisingly tough, easy and long-lived Juno-type iris. My original clump is close to 20 years old. Flowers with bright yellow falls and creamy flags or born on short corn-like stalks to 16"(40cm) tall. Spring blooming. Full sun in well- drained soil, preferably on the drier side in summer. Zone 6. (4" Rnd pot - \$8.00)
235. *Lilium sargentiae* - A choice form of this species collected by Jens Nielsen. Flowers are white with pink exterior striping and a greenish throat. The long tubular flowers are very fragrant and are born on tall arching stems to 5'(1.5m) high. Requires acidic soil and good drainage. Zone 6. (4" Dp pot - \$12.00)
236. *Ornithogalum orthophyllum ssp. kochii* - Similar to *O. umbellatum* but does not multiply as readily! (4" Dp pot - \$6.00; 5 bulbs)
237. *Oxalis adenophylla* –(Silver Shamrock) – A bulbous species with grey-green foliage in dense clumps topped with white flowers flushed and veined lilac-pink. 3- 4"(7.5-10cm) high. Full sun to part-shade. Well-drained soil. Zone 5. (3.5" pot - \$5.00; 1 bulb)
238. *Rhodohypoxis baurii* - TENDER. A plant with small rhizomatous corms for pot culture in our climate. White to dark reddish-pink flowers appear just above the grey-green grass-like foliage in succession over a long period in summer. Multiplies very quickly. Give them sun to part-shade and constant moisture in summer. Store dry, cool and frost-free in winter and resume watering when new growth emerges in spring. To 4"(10cm) high.
- Rhodohypoxis baurii* 'Dawn' - TENDER. A large flowered selection with blush pink flowers. (3.5" pot - \$7.00; 6 bulbs)
 - Rhodohypoxis baurii* 'Douglas' - TENDER. A selection with dark bright pink flowers. (3.5" pot - \$7.00; 5 bulbs)

SEDGES (Insigne)

239. *Carex elata* 'Bowles Golden' - (Bowles Golden Sedge) A striking grass with arching bright golden-yellow foliage narrowly edged with green. Requires a constantly moist location in sun or part shade - will grow in shallow water. Forms a dense tuft to 2'(60cm) high & wide. Semi-evergreen - cut back in spring before new growth begins. Zone 5. (4" Dp pot - \$9.00)

RHODODENDRONS & AZALEAS (Insigne)

240. *Azalea* 'Alexander' - (*nakaharai* x 'Kin no sai'). A Polly Hill North Tisbury hybrid with large, deep reddish-orange flowers and a prostrate, irregular mounding-creeping habit. Late July blooming. To 8"(.2m) high and 3'(.9m) wide in 10 years. Zone 6. (4" Dp pot - \$15.00; only a few available)
241. *Azalea* 'Baby Dane' - ('Panda' x *kiusianum* 'Album') A very compact evergreen azalea by Jens Birck of Denmark. Pure white flowers smother this hybrid which grows only 10"(.25m) high. Zone 6, possibly colder. (4" Dp pot - \$15.00)
242. *Azalea* 'Hot Pink' - ('Pink Clusters' x *nakaharai* 'Mt. Seven Stars') - A John Weagle hybrid with large vibrant hot pink flowers in profusion. Near prostrate habit. Zone 6, possibly colder. (3.5" pot - \$15.00; only a few available)
243. *Azalea* 'Scotian Clouds' - ('Kolmo Kulshan' x 'Lady Louise'). A John Weagle hybrid with white flowers edged bright reddish-pink. Late-June blooming. Dense, low horizontal-spreading habit growing to 18"(.45m) high. Zone 6. (4" Dp pot - \$15.00)
244. *Azalea* 'Scotian Fire' - ('Pink Clusters' x *nakaharai* 'Mt. Seven Stars'). A late-June blooming Weagle hybrid with large orange-red flowers. Compact mounding habit to 16"(.4m) high x 2'(.6m) wide in 10 years. Zone 6. (4" Dp pot - \$15.00; only a few available)
245. *Azalea* 'Scotian Glow' - (formerly offered as "Latest Compact Pink") {'Lady Louise' x ['Lady Louise x (*nakaharai* Orange Form X *kiusianum* 'Mt Fuji')#1-1]}. A sister seedling of 'Scotian Mirage' and 'Scotian Picotee', this is the latest to flower blooming at the end of July. Flowers are bright pink. Dense mounded habit growing to 12"(.3m) high x 2'(.6m) wide in 15 years. Zone 6. (4" Dp pot - \$15.00)
246. *Azalea* 'Scotian Mirage' - {'Lady Louise' x ['Lady Louise' x (*nakaharai* Orange Form X *kiusianum* 'Mt Fuji')#1-1]}. Large flowers of the very palest white-lavender. Dense horizontal spreading habit to 16"(.4m) high x 32"(.8m) wide in 12 years. A late-July blooming hybrid by John Weagle. Zone 6. (4" Dp pot - \$15.00)
247. *Azalea* 'Scotian Mist' - {'Lady Louise' x ['Lady Louise' x (*nakaharai* Orange Form x *kiusianum* 'Mt. Fuji')#1-1]}. A John Weagle hybrid with soft pastel-pink flowers shading to white in the centres although some flowers may be all pink or all white. July-blooming. Dense low horizontal-spreading habit growing to 18"(.45m) high. Zone 6. (4" Dp pot - \$15.00)
248. *Azalea* 'Scotian Picotee' - {'Lady Louise' x ['Lady Louise' x (*nakaharai* Orange Form X *kiusianum* 'Mt. Fuji')#1-1]}. Dense horizontal spreading habit to 16"(40cm) high x 32"(80cm) wide in 12 years. White with strong pink tips. A July-blooming Weagle hybrid. Zone 6. (4" Dp pot - \$15.00)

249. ***Azalea* ‘Scotian Reef’** - {‘Lady Louise’ x [‘Lady Louise’ x (*nakaharai* Orange Form X *kiusianum* ‘Mt. Fuji’)#1-1]}. Flowers vary from medium coral-pink to white. Dense horizontal spreading habit to 16”(4m) high x 32”(8m) wide in 12 years. A July-blooming Weagle hybrid. Zone 6. (4” Dp pot - \$15.00)
250. ***Azalea* ‘Scotian Rosebud’** - {‘Lady Louise’ x [‘Lady Louise’ x (*nakaharai* Orange Form X *kiusianum* ‘Mt. Fuji’)#1-1]}. The first North American offering of this Weagle hybrid. Fully double rose-like soft-pink flowers open over a long period in July. Dense, horizontal spreading habit to 16”(4m) high x 32”(8m) wide in 12 years. Zone 6. (4” Dp pot - \$20.00)
251. ***Azalea* ‘Scotian Snow’ (formerly ‘Flat White’)** - A Weagle evergreen hybrid of undetermined parentage grown by Wendy Cornwall; quite likely [‘Cascade’ x (*nakaharai* Orange Form X *kiusianum* ‘Mt. Fuji’)]. Forms a very low-growing, flat-topped bush which covers itself in a sheet of white flowers with green spotting. Zone 6. (4” Dp pot - \$15.00; only a few available)
252. ***Azalea* “Steele’s Late and Lovely”** - A charming Steele hybrid with a spreading almost prostrate habit. Large coral-pink flowers are borne very late in the season - one of the last to bloom in late July to early August. A hardy Satsuki hybrid. Zone 6. (4” Dp pot - \$15.00; only a few available)
253. ***Rhododendron atlanticum* (Coast Azalea)** – A deciduous azalea species with fragrant white flowers opening from pink buds. Blue-green foliage. Upright, suckering habit to 3’(90cm) high and wide. Zone 6. (Open-pollinated seedlings). (3.5” pot - \$12.00)
254. ***Rhododendron* ‘Isola Bella’** - (*fletcherianum* ‘Yellow Bunting’; x *dauricum* v. *album* ‘Arctic Pearl’ selfed). A Joseph Brueckner hybrid, once known as “Mabel R.” Beautiful dark green distinct foliage with excellent winter leaf retention. Peach buds open pastel pink and fade to white. Smashing, floriferous and very early. To 5’(1.5m) high x 4’(1.2m) wide with a dense, upright- spreading habit. Bud hardy to -5°F(-20°C) - plant much hardier. Zone 6. (4” pot - \$15.00)
255. ***Rhododendron kaempferi* ‘William Tritt’** - A selection of this evergreen azalea species grown and named by John Weagle. Salmon-pink flowers. Upright and very elegant habit to 8’(2.4m) high. Zone 6. (3.5” pot - \$12.00)
256. ***Rhododendron leucaspis* RSBG** – An early blooming species with unique oval foliage covered in bristly hairs. White flat-faced flowers are born early in spring and accented by dark anthers. A TENDER species for pot culture. (3.5” pot - \$12.00)

OTHER ERICACEOUS SHRUBS (Insigne)

257. ***Menziesia ciliicalyx* v. *purpurea* (now *Rhododendron benhalii*)** - A deciduous shrub growing to 2’(60cm) high with a shrubby mounded habit. Its urn-shaped flowers are purplish pink and are held in loose drooping clusters. Zone 6. These are open-pollinated seedlings. (4” Dp pot - \$15.00)
258. ***Menziesia* (*Rhododendron*) ex ‘Dartmoor Evening Glow’** - Unbloomed open-pollinated seedlings of this Barry Starling hybrid with salmon flowers. Will form a small deciduous shrub to about 5’(1.5m) tall. Zone 6. (4” Dp pot - \$15.00)

259. ***Menziesia (Rhododendron) ex 'Dartmoor Shepherd's Delight'*** - Unbloomed open-pollinated seedlings of this Barry Starling hybrid with rose-pink flowers. Will form a small deciduous shrub to about 5' (1.5m) tall. Zone 6. (4" Dp pot - \$15.00)
260. ***Menziesia (Rhododendron) "Scotian Spring"*** - Grown from seed of Barry Starling's *M. 'Spring Morning'*, this hybrid has bright pink urn-shaped flowers and glaucous blue foliage. Deciduous. To 5' (1.5m) high. Name suggested by Barry himself. Zone 6. (6" Dp pot - \$25.00)
261. ***Oxydendron arboreum*** – (Sourwood) A slow growing deciduous tree with large arching panicles of white lily-of-the-valley-like flowers in summer. Beautiful glossy deep green narrow foliage. Incredible persistent maroon, scarlet or plum fall colour. Slow growing pyramidal habit to 25' (7.5m) high x 20' (6m) wide with a rounded top and drooping branches. Zone 6. (4" Dp pot - \$15.00)

TREES & SHRUBS (Insigne)

262. ***Buxus sempervirens 'Rotundifolia'*** - An interesting boxwood with large stiff rounded leaves. Best utilized as a specimen plant. Tall rounded habit. Zone 6. (3.5" pot - \$7.00)
263. ***Hedera helix 'Buttercup'*** - A striking English Ivy cultivar with butter yellow new foliage when grown in full sun. Slow growing. (4" Dp pot - \$6.00)
264. ***Magnolia sieboldii ex Korean Seedling*** - These are seedlings of a plant grown from seed collected wild in Korea. The flowers are larger and more outward facing than most in cultivation. The pure white flowers have a pink to burgundy stamens and open from mid-June to late July against fresh green foliage. This species has an added bonus of bright pink seed pods in fall from which dangle bright orange seeds. A vigorous small, bushy tree, growing to 15' (4.5m) tall. Part shade. Zone 5b. (4" Dp pot - \$10.00)
265. ***Skimmia japonica and S. japonica var. repens*** - An evergreen shrub with dark glossy green foliage and clusters of tiny citrus-fragrant white flowers earliest spring. Flowers are followed by bright shiny red berries with a male pollinator. Compact mounded habit growing 2-3' (60-90cm) high. The *var. repens* is about half that height. Tolerates dry shade when established. Protect from winter sun and wind. Zone 6.

 - b. "Dwarf Male" – (3.5" pot - \$8.00)
 - c. "White -Berried" – (3.5" pot - \$8.00)
 - d. *var. Repens* – (3.5" pot - \$8.00)
266. ***Stewartia rostrata*** - A small tree growing 15' (5.0m) tall. White camellia-like flowers tinged red with yellow stamens in late-spring. Zone 6 in protected spots. (6" Dp pot - \$25.00)
267. ***Tetradium daniellii (Evodia daneillii)*** - A deciduous tree with 6" (15cm) corymbs of fragrant white flowers in late summer. Bees love them. Flowers are followed by reddish-purple seed pods. Long pinnate foliage. Grows to 30' (9.15m) high. Zone 5. (1 gal. - \$20.00)
